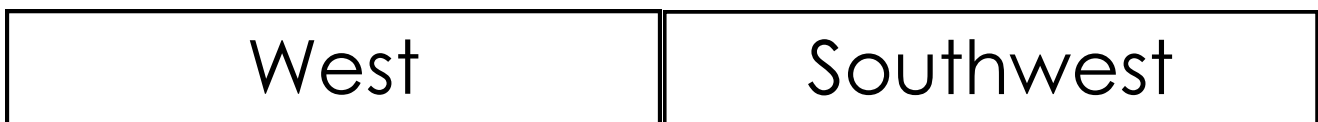
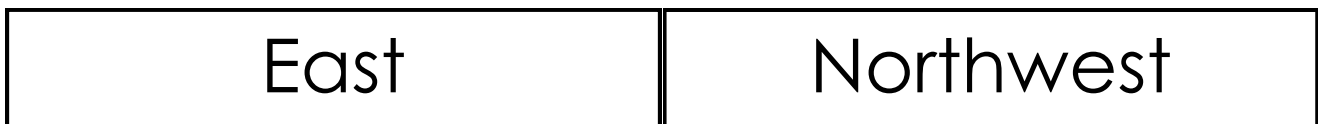
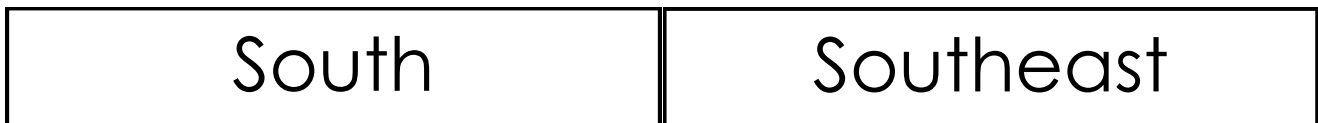
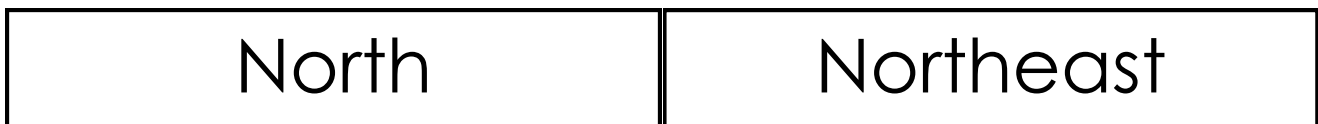
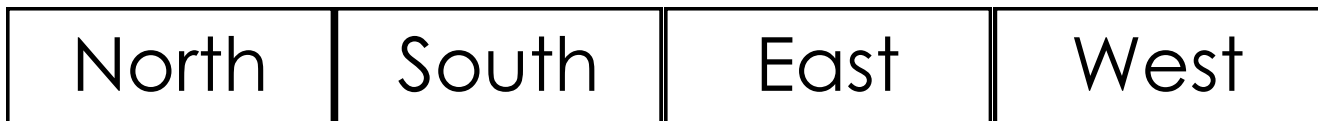
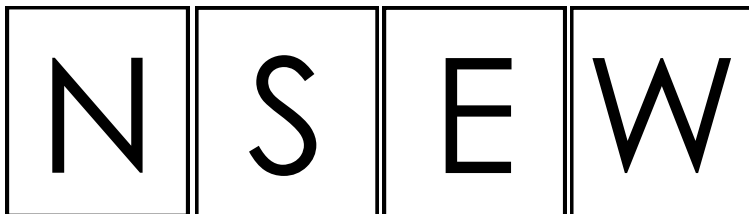
Children who are non-writers

The labels below can be printed, cut out, and used with the blank work cards.

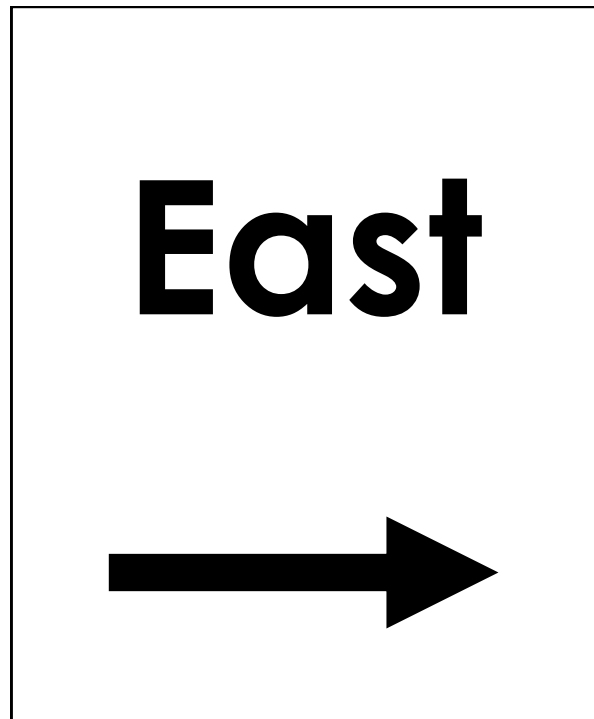
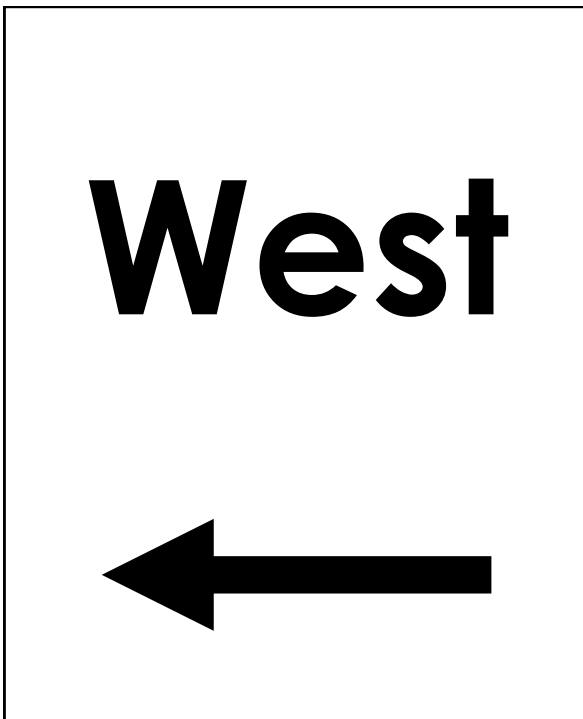
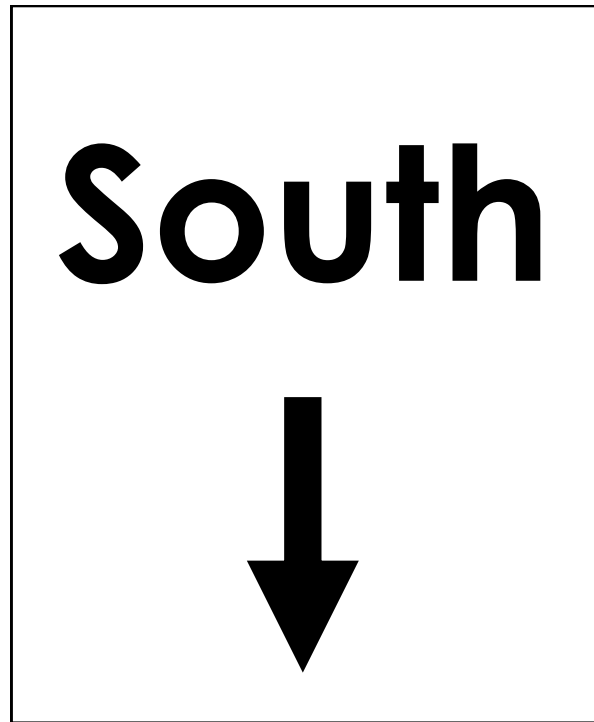
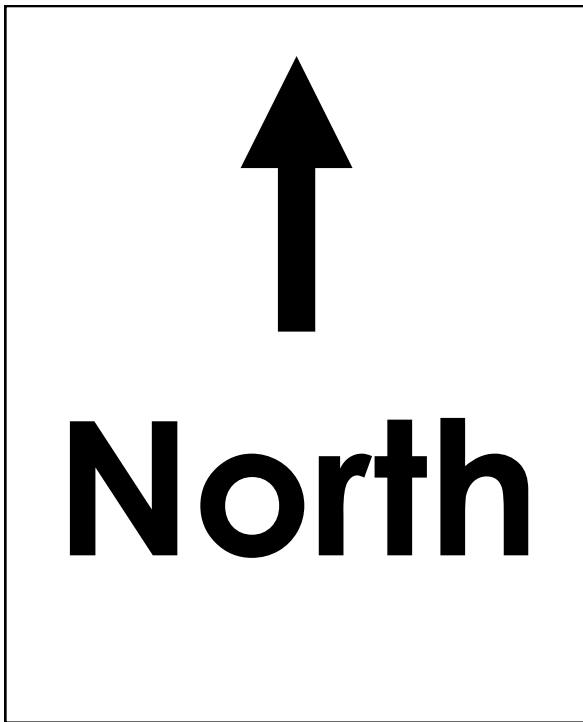
Children who are writers

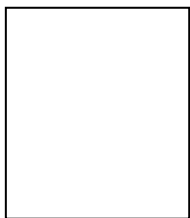
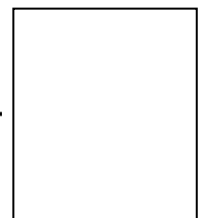
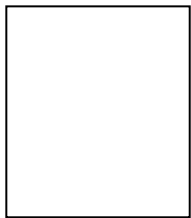
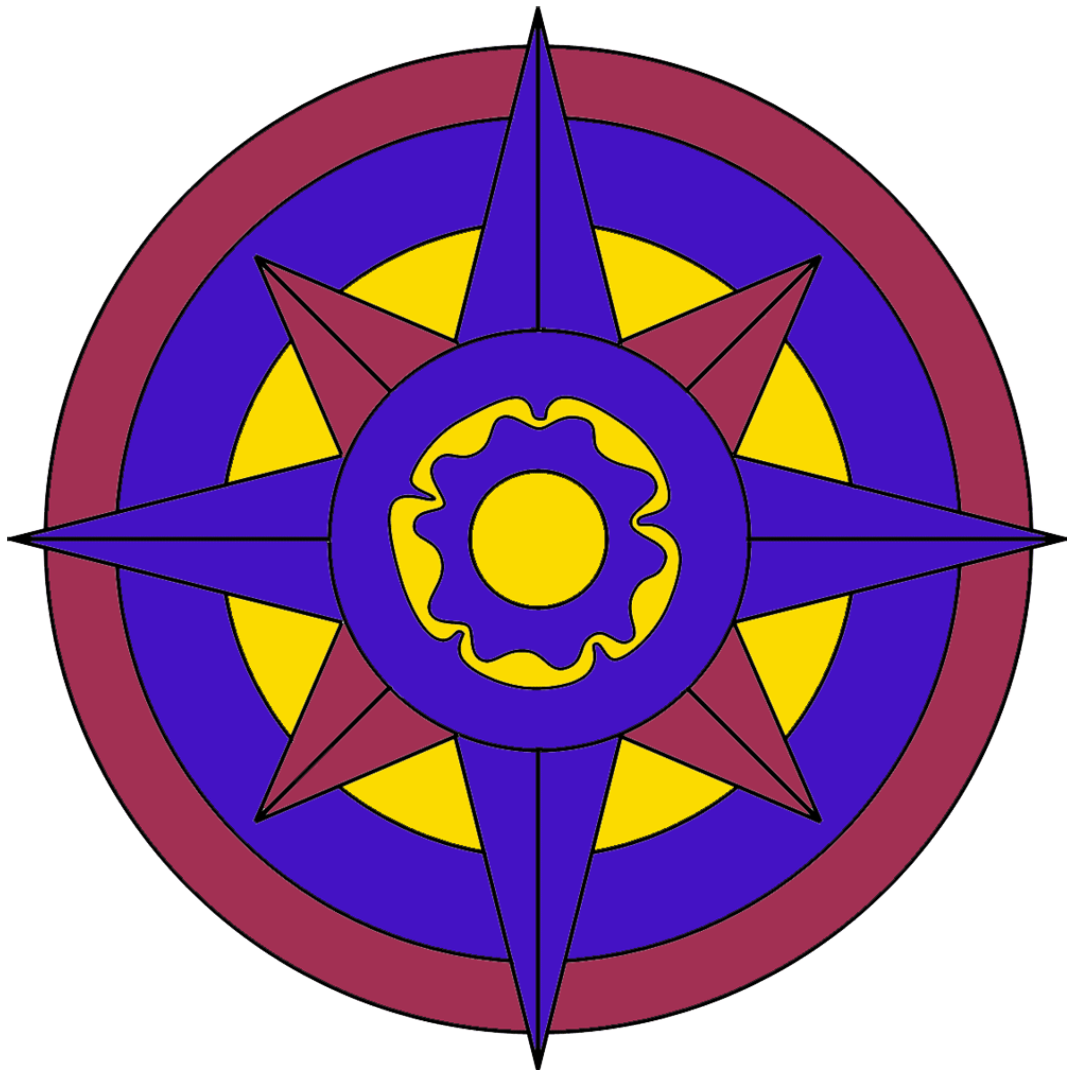
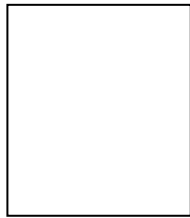


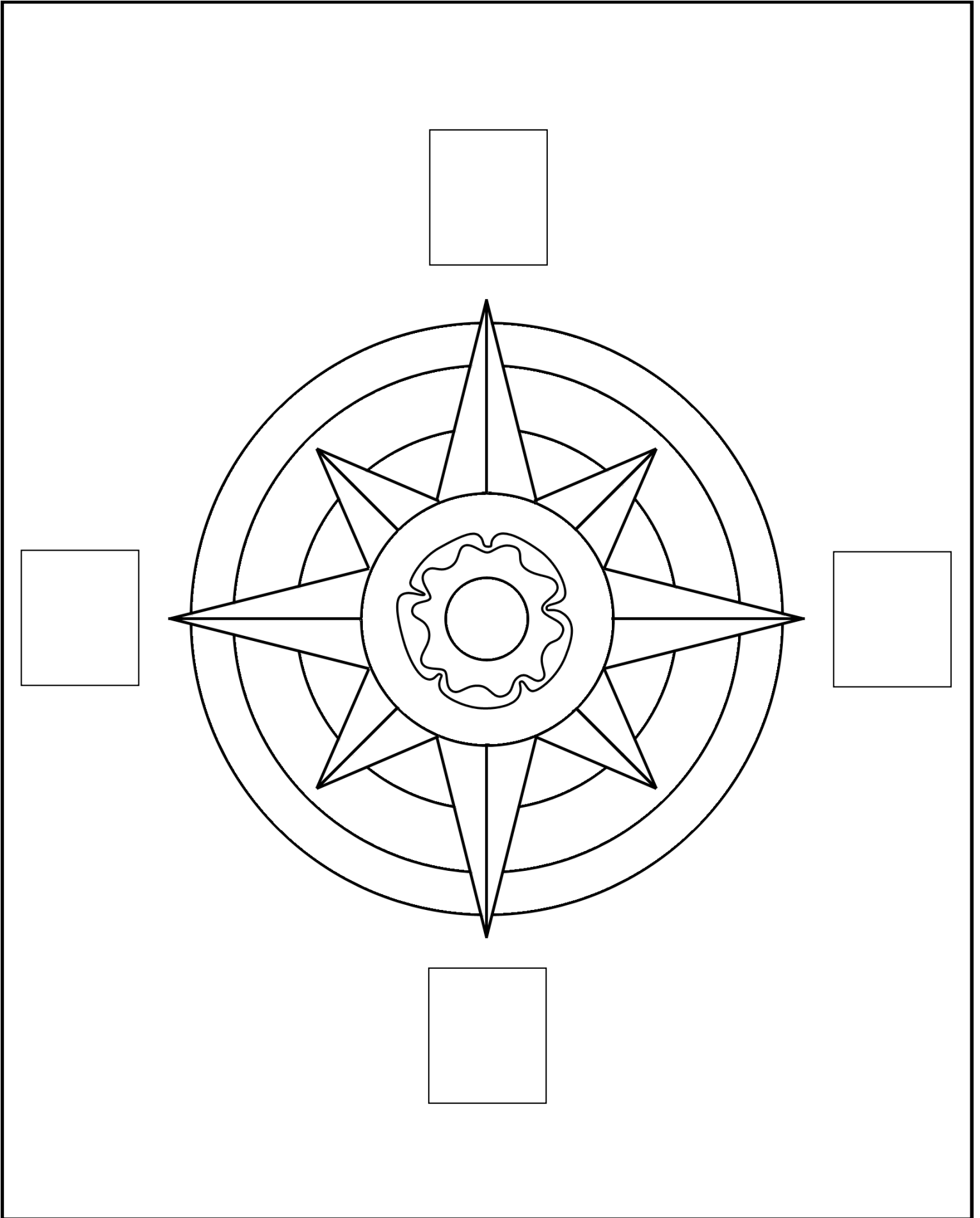
These direction cards can be used when introducing a child to the process of using a compass. Explain that the Earth has a magnetic North Pole.
